NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing on the matter of adoption of rules and regulations for the South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD), or the amendments thereto, will be held on Friday, November 5, 2021 in the Dr. William A. Burke Auditorium at South Coast AQMD Headquarters, 21865 Copley Drive, Diamond Bar, CA 91765, at 9:00 a.m., at which time evidence will be taken and all interested persons will be heard by the South Coast AQMD Board. The meeting will also be conducted via webcast with opportunities for public comment. Given the health and safety concerns regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19), auditorium seating availability may be limited and the meeting format may be changed to full remote via webcast. Please refer to South Coast AQMD's website for information regarding the format of the Public Hearing, updates if the meeting is changed to a full remote via webcast format, and details on how to participate: http://www.aqmd.gov/home/news-events/meeting-agendas-minutes.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the South Coast AQMD is considering the adoption of Proposed Rule 1109.1 – Emissions of Oxides of Nitrogen from Petroleum Refineries and Related Operations (Proposed Rule 1109.1). The objective of Proposed Rule 1109.1 is to reduce NOx emissions, while not increasing CO emissions. Proposed Rule 1109.1 will establish NOx and CO emission limits and averaging times to meet the proposed NOx and CO emission limits for combustion equipment located at petroleum refineries and facilities with operations related to petroleum refineries, which includes, asphalt plants, biofuel plants, hydrogen production plants, facilities that operate petroleum coke calciners, sulfuric acid plants, and sulfur recovery plants. PR 1109.1 includes alternative implementation plans to achieve the NOx and CO emission limits, provisions for time extensions, source testing provisions, recordkeeping and reporting requirements, and exemptions.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the South Coast AQMD is considering the adoption of Proposed Rule 429.1 –Startup and Shutdown Provisions at Petroleum Refineries and Related Operations (Proposed Rule 429.1). The objective of Proposed Rule 429.1 is to provide an exemption from the NOx and CO emission limits in Proposed Rule 1109.1 during startup, shutdown, and certain maintenance events. Proposed Rule 429.1 will establish provisions for

startup, shutdown, and certain maintenance events, and notification and recordkeeping provisions for units that are subject to Proposed Rule 1109.1.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the South Coast AQMD is considering the amendment of Proposed Amended Rule 1304 – Exemptions (Proposed Amended Rule 1304) and Proposed Amended Rule 2005 – New Source Review for RECLAIM (Proposed Amended Rule 2005). The objective of Proposed Amended Rule 1304 and Proposed Amended Rule 2005 is to provide a narrow exemption from Best Available Control Technology for PM10 and SOx emission increases associated with projects where the installation of add-on air pollution control equipment on an existing unit or installation of new units with add-on pollution control equipment is to meet the proposed NOx limits in Proposed Rule 1109.1. Proposed Amended Rule 1304 establishes a series of conditions for using this exemption, including provisions to ensure federal New Source Review requirements are met.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the South Coast AQMD is considering rescinding Rule 1109 – Emissions of Oxides of Nitrogen from Boilers and Process Heaters in Petroleum Refineries (Proposed Rescinded Rule 1109). Rule 1109 will also be rescinded because with the adoption of Proposed Rule 1109.1, the existing Rule 1109 will be outdated and not necessary.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that Proposed Rule 1109.1, Proposed Rule 429.1, Proposed Amended Rule 1304, and Proposed Amended Rule 2005 will be submitted to the California Air Resources Board and the United States Environmental Protection Agency for inclusion into the State Implementation Plan.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that Proposed Rule 1109.1, Proposed Rule 429.1, Proposed Amended Rule 1304, Proposed Amended Rule 2005, and Proposed Rescinded Rule 1109 implement Sections 110, 172, 173, and 182(e) of the Clean Air Act.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that a written analysis pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 40727.2 has been prepared that identifies all existing federal air pollution control requirements, all South Coast AQMD existing and proposed rules and regulations, and all pollution control requirements and guidelines that apply to the same equipment or source type as the rules proposed for adoption and amendment.
